



What does my child need for a day at Nursery?

“When life gives you rainy days, put on your boots and jump in the puddles”

There's no such thing as bad weather, only bad clothing! That's why we encourage children to come to nursery dressed for each season, ready to play and prepared to enjoy the freedom of play and learning in our beautiful nature garden. On sunny days, we ask that your child has an appropriate all day sun cream applied before they arrive at nursery.

Playing outside is great for physical development, learning language and building relationships and so being prepared for all weathers is really important. We ask that children come dressed in clothes appropriate for the season and outdoor play and we provide a seasonal Parent Guide [HERE](#). Every day your child needs to arrive wearing:

Clothing Kit List

- Wellington boots
- Named waterproof trousers
- Named jacket or coat appropriate for the time of year
- Named sun hat or winter hat
- Hordle school hoodie or jumper (optional)

A Rucksack

Playing in our beautiful garden is a really big part of the children's time with us. Jumping in puddles, digging in mud and playing with water is lots of fun, but can be very messy so we request that all children bring plenty of named spares in a named rucksack each day including:

- 2 spare t-shirts, 2 spare trousers and 2 spare jumpers
- 2-3 pairs spare pants and socks
- Please include more spares if your child is potty or toilet training
- Pull ups, nappies and wipes if your child is potty or toilet training

Additional Items

- Packed lunch in a named, hard, washable lunch box (which should include an ice pack to keep food cool)
- Named and filled water bottle

We request that to prevent loss or damage children are encouraged to leave toys at home where they can be kept safe. For safety reasons please do not send your child to nursery wearing jewellery, crocs or open-toed sandals.
