

Is your child interested in learning to play a brass instrument?

We are growing brass musicians at Hordle Wednesday afternoons! We already have a beginning trumpet and 2 new cornet musicians at school who played in the recent New Milton Music Festival and at a school assembly. Can we grow any more? We usually start on trumpet or cornet but depending on the child's size we can also start French horn, tenor horn and trombone.

I teach on Wednesday afternoons and depending on interest and uptake I can offer group and individual lessons, lasting between 15-30 minutes and costing between £5 and £18, depending on size of group and length of lesson. I have a few extra trumpets for borrow and I can help you hire an instrument from the local music service/music shops.

I am an experienced and enthusiastic local brass musician and teacher. I work as a peripatetic and private brass teacher, teaching trumpet, cornet, French horn, tenor horn and trombone. I also teach school brass groups and have my own young brass band called 'Brasstastic'. My pupils play in local youth bands, brass bands and orchestras, participate in music festivals and take graded music exams.

Scientific research has shown that learning to play a musical instrument is a great benefit to the educational development of a child. It is proven that young musicians perform well in other academic subjects as the result of the concentration and discipline required to learn an instrument. In addition, playing an orchestral instrument, such as a brass instrument, brings camaraderie and joy from making music in a group. My job is to introduce, teach and encourage children the fun and joy of brass music making.
