### What's on this half term?

#### Geography

Children will learn about the weather patterns on Earth. They will look at hot areas (the equator) and cold areas (the poles)

#### DI

Sports Day is Monday 7th July. The gates for KS1 will open at 1.50pm.

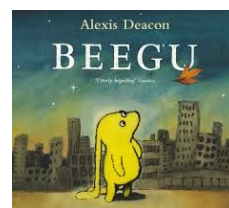
### Maths

- Describing properties of 2D and 3D shapes
- Describing position and turns
- Interpreting data from pictograms, tally charts and block diagrams
- Consolidating addition subtraction, multiplication and division



### English

- **The Sun and the Wind**  
Children will read the traditional fable before thinking about the characteristics of the Sun and the Wind.
- **Beegu**  
Children will use their geography knowledge to write a guide to Earth for Beegu
- **Nimesh the Adventurer**  
Children will engage in imaginative stories before writing their own imaginative tour of our school



## Supporting your child at home

**Reading** - we ask that children read 4x per week and that this is recorded in their reading challenge. Reading challenges are expected to be in school every day.

**Spellings** - We really appreciate your support in helping your child to learn their weekly spellings. They will be tested each Friday.

**Numbots** - Regular practise helps with many areas of the Key Stage One maths curriculum.
